Master's Degree in **International Relations and European Studies**

The Master in International Relations and European Studies (RISE) is a two-year interdisciplinary programme fully taught in English. The aim of the programme is to create a multicultural environment that will attract students from different countries. Furthermore, RISE is enriched by a variety of courses financed by the European Commission within the Jean Monnet Programme. Students can also take advantage of the European Documentation Centre located in the Main Library.

The programme consists of a common first year intended to provide a legal, economic, historical and political science background for advanced studies in international and European affairs. In the second year students may choose an **International Relations** or a **European Studies** track.

International Relations Track

This track provides students with in-depth knowledge of:

- a. international organizations;
- b. international economic, financial and trade issues;
- c. international law and human rights protection;
- d. education and healthcare across the world; the influence of religion on international relations;
- e. the historical development and current profile of the main geo-political areas in the world.

European Studies Track

The European Studies track provides students with in-depth knowledge of the structure and functioning of the European Union, including the formation and content of EU policies, the impact of the EU on national contexts, and its role in the international arena.

Mixed-Language Option

Students can opt for a mixed language track in which some of the courses are offered in Italian.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Prospective students must possess a three-year university degree or diploma. The Admissions Committee will evaluate students' applications on the basis of past personal and academic accomplishments, including exam scores in history, political science, economics and law. Students that do not fulfil the requirements will have to pass an examination in the specific areas indicated by the Admissions Committee, prior to the admission.

INTERNSHIPS

Degree requirements include at least 150 hours of internship. RISE has over a hundred agreements with public organizations, interest associations, NGOs, private enterprises and research centres in Italy and abroad. The European Studies track offers three-months internship opportunities in Brussels, in particular under the Erasmus+ Traineeship Programme.

AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN UNIVERSITIES

RISE offers a number of opportunities to study abroad, both in the context of the Erasmus Exchange Programme and of the School's agreements with foreign universities such as Peking University, James Madison University and Tongji University. In addition, RISE has a Joint Study Programme with the Master's Degree in International Relations of Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO) that allows students to complete a year of study in Moscow and obtain a double degree from both Florence and Moscow Universities.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The University of Florence is recognized by the EU Commission as a Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence. This allows RISE to offer a wide variety of extracurricular activities, such as the RISE Guest Seminars. In addition, RISE promotes a simulation of the EU Council in collaboration with the James Madison University.

CAREER PROSPECTS

The International Relations track prepares students for careers in:

The European Studies track prepares students for careers in:

- ➔ National and Multinational enterprises operating in areas connected to EU policy

- ➔ EU consultancies and lobbying agencies
